Learning through religious and moral education enables the children to recognise religion as an important expression of human experience; learn about beliefs and traditions of Christianity and other world religions; recognise and understand religious diversity; investigate and understand the responses which religious and non-religious views can offer about the nature and meaning of life.

Through our classroom lessons we aim to help our pupils develop a knowledge and understanding of Christianity and other world religions and to encourage pupils to learn about important moral values, particularly in their relationships with others.

Within religious education pupils learn about the various ways in which religious belief is expressed through festivals, ceremonies, sacred places, holy books and key figures in religion. Pupils are given the opportunity to think about personal aspects of religion and to consider questions related to religion as an important expression of human experience.

Religious observance is carried out at some assemblies and special events. Religious observance is a time for reflection which helps the children to develop their inner self awareness and their relationships with others and their environment, for example, they may be given a time to share ideas on friendship and what it means for them.

I would like to remind parents that Scottish Government Ministers consider that religious observance complements religious education and makes an important contribution to pupils' development. It should also have a role in promoting the ethos of a school by bringing pupils together and creating a sense of community.

There is a statutory provision for parents to withdraw children from participation in religious observance. This right of parents' wishes will be respected. Where a child is withdrawn from religious observance, we will make suitable arrangements for your child to participate in a worthwhile alternative activity

As part of our annual planning we had a meeting with some of our Pupil Council, a staff member and Alex Kelly in order to discuss what we would like for our assemblies over the course of the year.

After a discussion we agreed that we would have assemblies on the same day of the week but would try to achieve a balance of mornings and afternoons so that all nursery children are able to come. The children felt they would like them at the end of the week so that they could work towards House Points and Citizen of the Week.

We discussed what the children would like during assemblies. They agreed that they like the active assemblies that Mr Kelly takes and where they are able to have some time to reflect. They also liked poetry and singing. Visitors are also welcome at assembly. The children indicated that they would like themes such as anti-bullying, teamwork, friendship, honesty etc.

Since our discussions I have put together an assembly timetable in order to reflect the ideas that were discussed at our meeting. I will include this in our 'Dates for Your Diary' section of newsletters.

We agreed that Primary 6 would continue to take part in Bubblegum 'n Fluff which works through the Christmas message as the children take part in activities. We also discussed trying a reflective spaces approach to giving the children time to reflect on their hopes and dreams and what they would like for their futures and changes that they may face. This would fit in nicely with our Health Week and the idea of mental and emotional health - it would sit very well with the massage and relaxation that we try to encourage with the children throughout the year.

## ROAD SAFETY



Our Junior Road Safety Officers, Elise Knights and Max Grant, attended South Lanarkshire's JRSO training event. They picked up lots of ideas to encourage our children to cross the road safely and to keep safe as they travel to and from school and home.

They were able to sit in the cab of a lorry in order to help them realise how hard it is for lorry drivers to see children close to their lorry. They have been busy updating the JRSO information board and organising a competition for the children. The JRSOs will be leading our assembly at the end of October in order to share important road safety messages with all of our children.

Our Primary 5 children will soon be taking part in their Bikeability programme in order to make them more aware of road safety while cycling. This leads into the Primary 6 Bikeability programme which is offered during the final term in P6. As part of our Travel Planning we are looking at a scooter safety programme too.



## SPORTS

Once again we are delighted that Biggar Rugby Club are offering some rugby sessions for the P4 - P7 children. They are also organising a rugby festival for the P5 - P7 children. Our thanks to them for all their coaching which the children enjoy and it really helps to develop their skills.
