


Children will make masks etc. on the lead up to Hallowe'en to wear on the day. The costumes can be expensive and this decision has been taken as a positive step towards reducing the cost of the school day which is a priority for our school, the local authority and the Scottish Government.

# Pupil Equity Funding – Participatory Budget

We will shortly be seeking your views on how we should spend a portion of our Pupil Equity Fund this year. We have £1715 allocated to this. The consultation will start with the children and we will share their ideas with you and give you the opportunity to vote for how you think the money should be spent. This budget is allocated to the school each year to allow us to minimise the detrimental impact poverty can have on a child's learning and ensure all children have equal opportunity of a variety of experiences.

## **Class News**



#### Р1

P1 have an amazing start to school. They have already been working on their fine motor skills, holding a pencil and writing their names.

This term, we will be working on rhyming words and phonic sounds. We will identify words with those sounds and learn how to write them. For numeracy, we are learning to count, add and write numbers to 10.

We read the rainbow fish at the start of the term and found an interest in creatures that live under the sea! So our topic this term is under the sea, where we will learn about the different animals that live in the sea. We will use this topic for play based learning and arts and crafts.

#### P7

Everyone has settled into P7 well and has been busy working hard. This term we will be exploring persuasive techniques and writing our own adverts as well as learning about finding tales and creating our own stories through Talk for Writing. In maths we will be extending our knowledge of number processes and building confidence with the four operations. We will be exploring the solar system through our science topic and learning how we can help with environmental and social issues in our local area. P7 are all very excited for the year ahead and can't wait for their residential trip to Lockerbie Manor in October!

## P4/5

P4/5 are working on their class novel which is 'Stig of the Dump' by Clive King. They are enjoying finding out about all the adventures that the main character, Barney, and his friend Stig have while also developing their comprehension skills using various reading strategies. This work has led to a topic on pre-historic times and discovering what life was like for people back then.

In Numeracy, the children are working on place value and estimating and rounding numbers. They are also developing mental maths strategies to help them calculate answers to problems.

We are focusing on Emotion Works during Health and Wellbeing lessons and are revising the 5 cog model; this involves us looking closely at what triggers our emotions, how we feel and what we can do to regulate our emotions and make ourselves feel better. We are also working hard to understand and demonstrate our new school values - happy, safe, friendship and respect.

#### P2/3

We have had such an exciting start to P2/3 this year. We have started looking at the story of Elmer and discussing how we are all unique and that that's ok! We have made lots of new friends and have been spending time getting to know each other. In Term 1 for Literacy, we will be reading lots of new Biff, Chip and Kipper stories and learning about summarising stories and making predictions. We will also be writing about ourselves in class too. In Numeracy, Primary 2 are working on using numbers 1-100 and being able to read, count and work with them. Primary 3 are learning numbers all the way to 1000. Our IDL topic this term is going to be Space as the children

showed a keen interest in this topic, when trying to watch the Artemis rocket launch (which is still yet to happen!!) We can't wait for all the fun activities we have planned this term!

#### P5/6

P5/6 are developing their reading skills and strategies through their class novel Kensuke's Kingdom. We will then move onto our Talk for Writing topic which is also based on our class novel. The children will also continue to work on their spelling strategies daily.

In Maths, we are working on Place Value, Estimating and Rounding and Addition and Subtraction this term

Their Interdisciplinary Topic this term is of course Kensuke's Kingdom where we will be developing skills such as researching online and offline using various types of reference sources. We will be learning about different countries and islands that are in the book incl. more in depth learning about Japan and we will touch on the war. They will compare life in Japan and Scotland and learn through drama, art, music, dance and science also.

P6 children will have their swimming lessons whilst P5 will have their bikeability.

#### Mrs Alexander and Miss Frew

P1 and P2 have been learning to log in and out of the computer and have been using their mouse to select, drag and drop. They will now move onto basic block programming activities, including sequencing and creating basic loops using 'code.org'

P3 - P7 have been learning how to write block codes for our new micro:bits. Throughout the term, they will use 'Microsoft Make Code' to enable to micro:bits to do a variety of activities such as; measuring temperature, creating sounds, measuring light and sound, plotting acceleration and many more exciting projects! They will also explore other platforms for coding such as 'Scratch' and 'code.org'.

#### P3/4

P3/4 started off the new school year by reading 'The Hodgeheg' by Dick King Smith and doing lots of interesting follow up activities, such as creating their own maps and designing 'Road Safety' posters. P3/4 are now getting into the swing of their usual phonics, spelling and reading activities and are enjoying accessing the library for personal reading and being creative in the writing area too.

We have been busy exploring numbers up to 100, 1000 and even 10,000 this term! They have been learning all about the value of each digit in a number. For example, the 5 in 350 represents 5 tens, or 50; however the 5 in 5,006 represents 5 thousands or 5,000. They have also been learning about odd and even numbers and counting up in 2's, 3's and 5's.

Some of the children were showing an interest in 'Space' and were eager to learn more about it. P3/4 have therefore decided to explore and investigate 'Space' as their topic this term and follow the current 'Artemis Rocket Launch' as part of this learning journey.
